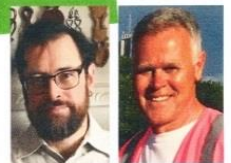

Planning appeal rejected

The planning application and appeal to demolish the business units at Chiltern House and replace them with residential units have been rejected.

Green campaigner Greg Smith says 'This is good news for the business community in Haddenham. It's hard enough to start up a new business without the challenge of finding an appropriate business unit'.
