Breakthrough on 20 mph limits: Police confirm they will enforce them


Contrary to what Transport for Buckinghamshire has often said, the Thames Valley Chief Constable has now confirmed that it is up to local councils to set the speed limit and for the police to enforce it. He clarified this after a question from **Councillor David Lyons** at a recent Council meeting. This means that villages, like Cuddington, wanting a 20 mph speed limit can now campaign confidently, knowing that they cannot be fobbed off by Transport for Buckinghamshire saying that the police will not enforce 20 mph limits. TRAFFIC CALMING IN LONG CRENDON

Transport for Buckinghamshire has approved traffic calming measures at the entrance to Long



Crendon on the Chearsley Road. The measures include a raised table to slow traffic and allow safer crossing, preceded by dragons' teeth road markings as you enter the village from Chearsley. Local residents opposed the idea of rumble strips, which cause vibration in neighbouring properties but welcome the idea of slowing traffic down and having a safe crossing point.

Following the consultation and discussions with the Long Crendon Save our Surgery Working Group, the Parish Council and other bodies, the Clinical Commissioning Group has decided that it could support the development of a multi-use facility in the village that involved dispensing and some healthcare clinics. The Parish Council has provided money for an architect to draw up plans for the new facility, to be located at Greenings on the Chearsley Rd. This is positive news after much hard work by local people.

Residents are asked to make sure they get prescriptions dispensed at the surgery to ensure it receives the much-needed income.
