Callie's Solar Farm – the dilemma



The planned site is situated south east of Haddenham on mainly poor quality agricultural land with a small area of medium quality land. The installation would generate 50 MW of clean energy, making it a large-scale solar farm. Our MP has objected to the farm on the grounds of the beauty of the local landscape and the loss of agricultural land. These are valid points but does he know about the vital importance of local energy schemes in mitigating climate change. Here is a real dilemma, how do you prioritise the urgent need for local, clean energy, against the loss of farmland? The government has made it almost impossible to plan any more onshore wind farms which would be more efficient and take up less space. One solution seems to be switching more of our land from livestock to arable which will feed us more efficiently. It's time the government and their MPs stopped being part of the problem and led us to a green, carbon zero, future.

CLIMATE CHANGE - WHAT WE Can do now

Here are some important ways we can influence and reduce carbon output:

- Write to your MP and ask him to make sure the government delivers their carbon targets for 2050 – they are off-track at present
- 2. Use public transport or cycle but use your car less
- 3. Reduce your flying and if you do fly do some carbon off-setting
- 4. Use a renewable energy tariff
- 5. Get your walls and loft insulated
- 6. Move towards a vegan diet
- 7. Generate your own energy with solar panels if you can
- 8. Adopt efficient recycling to reduce the waste that is burned which produces CO2
- 9. Support organisations like Friends of the Earth or the Green Party who are campaigning hard on this issue.
