Pavements causing problems



There is a particular problem for people with limited mobility or visual impairment who are prevented from taking simple exercise by the trip hazards across our pavements. Cllr Gregory Smith met with residents and arranged a meeting with Transport for Bucks to demand action. He said "we need to build pressure on Bucks Council to improve pavements across the area".

Gregory is also pressing for the resurfacing of Thame Rd, Haddenham, to stay a top priority... including the pavements.

Accessibility for the Community Orchard

Cllr Gregory Smith has been working with The Community Orchard and Stonehill House Care Home in Haddenham to develop an active aging project. The Orchard needs to be inclusive for all residents and provide volunteer opportunities for all. Gregory spoke with residents and staff when they visited the orchard in August – to test out the new accessible paths and raised beds. This allows people with limited mobility to get involved too.

Road accident zone - Haddenham



Local residents contacted Cllr Gregory Smith about the junction at Stanbridge Rd and Woodways in Haddenham. This has long been a source of accidents but recently an increasing number of cars have been crossing Woodways without stopping. Gregory got Transport for Bucks involved, taking immediate action to suspend the road sign that was causing confusion. They have also committed to refreshing the white lines. Gregory says "please report any road problems through 'Fix My Street', this is good for a lot more than just potholes. If you don't get a satisfactory response, contact me".
