Gregory says:

Haddenham-Thame Greenway: no progress after 20 years of campaigning



Gregory says "I can't believe it was over 20 years ago that I attended a huge cycle demonstration for a cycleway to Thame. Council leaders have been guizzed yet again on progress towards the vital Haddenham -Thame cycle

Council leaders have accepted the importance of this walking/cycling route but the response from the cabinet member was lacking vision and immediacy. We need to see a real commitment from the council and not hear meaningless words. Well done Haddenham Safe Walking & Cycling group for keeping up the pressure on the council."

Haddenham library threatened!



Haddenham Library is facing a 50% cut to funding. A community library, staffed mainly by volunteers, cannot cope with this financial shortfall. Cllr Gregory Smith met with the Library's Chair of Trustees to discuss the implications.

It is hoped that the Parish Council can step in to help. Bucks Council is cutting services, wherever it can, to manage yet another austerity budget imposed by central government. Gregory said "too much of our taxes are kept by the government at the expense of local services, including libraries. We need a change of government, with more green clout, and a renewed focus on our local services".

Solar PV on Council Buildings?



A council building is to be converted as accommodation for care leavers. Hurrah, a great initiative. Green Councillor Gregory Smith intervened, not to oppose, but to challenge why this expensive renovation didn't include full solar PV. As a result the head of council property will be required to explain. Gregory has repeatedly challenged the Council's failure to install renewable energy in its own developments. "we need solar PV on all public buildings if we can justify solar farms on good quality agricultural land." Said Gregory "the council must adopt a policy requiring consideration of renewable energy whenever we renovate or develop our own property".

Serious flooding in Ickford this January



Flooding at Worminghall Rd, Ickford Having experienced nearly three years of very low rainfall Ickford residents could be excused if they forgot that this village is surrounded by the flood plain of the River

Thame and so it floods during periods of sustained heavy

The village is supporting a growth in homes of over one third and that could be fine as long as care is taken when ridge and furrow fields are replaced by housing. Care about these aspects is key and we rely upon our councillors and Thames Water to ensure that local concerns and knowledge are taken into account in relation to planning issues.
